Portfolios should ideally include student interests with demonstration of their learning to help with potential careers, applicable college requirements, etc. Students should also include outside opportunities such as work study, internships, independent study and post-secondary education within the portfolio.	act as both a record/demonstration of student learning AND a roadmap to future goals would give students more buy-in and future application of their capstone work.  Parents suggested that this process be completed by the end of junior year (as opposed to the current senior year deadline) to allow students to implement their goals set forth in the portfolio (college applications, work study requirements, etc). It might also be beneficial for students to have check in points (such as sophomore year) to ensure that they are making progress.  To add a community element: students could possibly "defend" their portfolios to community members/staff on a panel that allows for student accountability for their work.  A process for transient students should also be considered and a formal process is needed for this within 4C
